The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act relative to increased efficiencies in state government..

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. “Notwithstanding any special or general law to the contrary, the state
2 treasurer shall furnish by electronic means a check stub or pay slip to every person who receives
3 compensation from the Commonwealth and whose compensation is provided to them by direct
4 deposit, unless such person does not have an electronic mail address provided by and maintained
5 by the Commonwealth. The treasurer shall continue to provide paper checks stubs and pay slips
6 to all such persons who receive a paper check from the Commonwealth and to those who do not
7 have an electronic mail address provided by and maintained by the Commonwealth. Any person
8 who does not wish to receive their check stub or pay slip electronically may request to continue

9 to receive a paper copy of their check stub or pay slip so long as they provide written notice to
10 the treasurer.”
