The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen

An Act relative to motor vehicle license suspension.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Subsection (f) of section 22 of Chapter 90 of the General Laws is hereby
2 repealed.

3 SECTION 2. The registrar of motor vehicles shall purge all records pertaining to past
4 motor vehicle license suspensions effected under subsection (f) of section 22 of Chapter 90 of
5 the General Laws.

6 SECTION 3. Section 30 of Chapter 90 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010
7 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding, after the second paragraph, the following
8 paragraph:- Upon expiration of the term of suspension of driving privileges suspended under
9 subsections, (g), (h), or (i), of Section 22 of Chapter 90, the registrar shall shield from public
10 access all records of the suspension and the underlying offense, including records of the
11 expiration of the suspension, any hearings or appeals related to the suspension, and the
12 reinstatement following the suspension.
