## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

An Act relative to executive employee compensation.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 6A of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014 Official Edition,
- 2 is hereby amended by inserting the following new section:-
- 3 Section 105. If an executive officer or employee of an executive office is to be
- 4 compensated at an annual rate higher than \$200,000, such compensation shall not be paid out of
- 5 the executive office's operating budget. All such compensation shall be funded by a separate
- 6 line-item, as defined in section 1 of chapter 29.
