By Mr. Tarr (by request), a petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 1797) of Joseph Toolan for legislation to create a Private Law Petition Policy Act. State Administration and Regulatory Oversight.

**In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court  
(2017-2018)**

An Act Private Law Petition Policy Act.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           Emergency Preamble-

2           “Whereas, the deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is  
3 forthwith to consolidate time and expense involved in the administration of Private Laws,  
4 therefore, it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation  
5 of the public convenience.”

6           Private Law Petition Policy Act Trust and its appointed commissioner is authorized to  
7 provide unused and unlimited treasury notes by the treasury on an ongoing basis for the  
8 following facilities and services:

9           Policy to Provide unlimited access, coverage and accommodations to develop and  
10 administer

- 11 Private Law Petition Policy Program to Authorize any government to administer,  
12 authorize and appropriate private registration of writs, appropriation and interests.  
13 To be signed into law before May 1,2017 and to take effect on June 1, 2017 [\$unlimited]
