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An Act to reform the charitable deduction.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 3 of chapter 62 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2020  
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out, in lines 151 and 152, the words “shall not be  
3 required to itemize their deductions in their federal income tax returns” and inserting in place  
4 thereof the following words:- "may only claim this deduction in a tax year in which they do not  
5 itemize their deductions in their federal income tax return".

6           SECTION 2. This Act shall apply to all tax years beginning after December 31, 2022.
