An Act to provide identification to homeless youth and families.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. The third sentence of the first paragraph of section 8E of chapter 90 of the

General Laws, as amended by section 57 of chapter 133 of the acts of 2016, is hereby amended

4 "including an exceptions process by which a person who is homeless, an unaccompanied

homeless youth, or a person who is otherwise unable to meet the established criteria may apply

6 for a Massachusetts identification card and have the fee, for the same, waived. For the purposes

of this section, the term "homeless", shall mean a person as defined by the Stewart B. McKinney

8 Homeless Assistance Act of 1987, § 103(a), 42 U.S.C. § 11302(a), as amended from time to

time, and the term "unaccompanied homeless youth", shall mean a person 24 years of age or

younger who is not in the physical custody or care of a parent or legal guardian and who lacks a

fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence."
