## AN ACT RELATIVE TO QUIET PAVEMENTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Section 15 of chapter 81 of the General Laws is hereby
2	amended by inserting after the first paragraph the following two paragraphs:
3	When a subject of any such contract includes the repavement of a state highway
4	within 200 feet of residential homes, a special type of quiet pavement material
5	must be used.
5	For the purposes of this section, "quiet pavement" shall mean a high-quality,
7	thoroughly controlled, engineered mixture made by heating asphalt cement and
3	mixing it with aggregates and mineral fillers, in proportions of 94 to 96 percent
)	aggregate and 4 to 6 percent asphalt cement.
