Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 ORDERED: That the City of Malden submit to the Massachusetts legislature for passage in
- 2 substantially the following form:
- 3 SECTION 1. Not withstanding section 58 of chapter 31 of the General Laws or an
- 4 other general or special law to the contrary, JosephWalklett of the City of Malden shall be
- 5 eligible to have his name certified for original appointment to the position of firefighter in the
- 6 City of Malden, notwithstanding his having reached the age of 32 before taking the civil service
- 7 examination in connection with that appointment, and shall be eligible for appointment to the
- 8 position of firefighter in the City of Malden provided he meets all other civil service
- 9 requirements.
 - SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
