In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act relative to veteran tax abatements.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- Section 5 of Chapter 59 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2018 Official Edition is hereby amended by inserting the following:-
- 3 Twenty-second I. Notwithstanding any provision of general or special law to the
- 4 contrary, an abatement granted pursuant to clause Twenty-second, Twenty-second A, Twenty-
- 5 second B, Twenty-second C, Twenty-second D, Twenty-second E, Twenty-second F, Twenty-
- 6 second G, Twenty-second H, shall be increased annually by a city or town in an amount not to
- 7 exceed the increase in the cost of living as determined by the Consumer Price Index for such
- 8 year.
