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By Mr. Rosenberg, a petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 1962) of Stanley C. Rosenberg and Peter V. Kocot (with the approval of the mayor and city council) for legislation to authorize the city of Northampton to issue an additional license for the sale of all alcoholic beverages to be drunk on the premises. Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure. [Local Approval Received.]

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The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

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**In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen**  
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An Act authorizing the city of Northampton to issue an additional license for the sale of all alcoholic beverages to be drunk on the premises.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Notwithstanding section 17 of chapter 138 of the General Laws or any  
2 other general or special law to the contrary, the licensing authority of the city of Northampton  
3 may grant an additional license for the sale of all alcoholic beverages to be drunk on the  
4 premises under section 12 of said chapter 138 to the Fairfield Inn, Inc located on Conz Street.  
5 The license shall be subject to all of said chapter 138, except said section 17.

6           The licensing authority shall not approve the transfer of the license to any other  
7 location, but it may grant the license to a new applicant at the same location if the applicant files  
8 with the licensing authority a letter from the department of revenue indicating that the license is  
9 in good standing with the department and that all applicable taxes have been paid.

10           If the license granted under this act is cancelled, revoked or not in use for at least 6  
11 consecutive months, it shall be returned physically, with all legal rights, privileges and  
12 restrictions pertaining thereto, to the licensing authority and the licensing authority may then  
13 grant the license to a new applicant at the same location under the same conditions as specified  
14 in this act.

15           SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage
