In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act relative to regional bonus aid.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 16D of chapter 71 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012

2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out subsection (g) and inserting in place thereof

3 the following section:-

4 (g) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions, regional bonus aid, but no other aid

5 pursuant to this section, shall be paid to any regional school district formed after fiscal year

5 nineteen hundred and ninety-three for the immediate five fiscal years following the establishment

7 of said regional school district, subject to appropriation. Regional bonus aid shall be payable in

8 an amount equal to one hundred dollars per foundation enrollment, in the first fiscal year

9 following the establishment of said regional school district; eighty dollars per foundation

10 enrollment in the second fiscal year following the establishment of said regional school district;

11 sixty dollars per foundation enrollment in the third fiscal year following the establishment of said

12 regional school district; forty dollars per foundation enrollment in the fourth fiscal year

13 following the establishment of said regional school district; and, twenty dollars per foundation

4 enrollment in the fifth fiscal year following the establishment of said regional school district.
