#### The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act relative to net metering.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 139 of chapter 164 is hereby amended by striking out subsection (f)
- and inserting in place thereof the following subsection:- (f) No aggregate net metering cap shall
- 3 apply to solar net metering facilities with the exception that the maximum amount of generating
- 4 capacity eligible for net metering by a municipality or other governmental entity shall be 10
- 5 megawatts.
