AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE PREPARATION OF CERTAIN BALLOTS IN THE CITY OF BOSTON.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. *Definitions* As used in this act, the following words shall, unless the
2 context requires otherwise, have the following meanings:

3 *Chinese surname* means any surname which appears on the Lauderdale and Kestenbaum list of
4 Chinese surnames.

5 *City* means the City of Boston.

6 *Election* shall mean any primary or election, as defined by section 1 of chapter 50 of the General
7 Laws.

8 *Transliteration* means the printing of relevant Chinese characters to represent the phonetic
9 equivalent of the syllables of an English name or a name in any other language that is not
10 traditionally written using Chinese characters.

11 *State election* shall mean any election at which a national, state, or county officer or a regional
12 district school committee member elected district-wide is to be chosen by the voters, whether for
13 a full term or for the filling of a vacancy.

14 *Vietnamese surname* means any surname which appears on the Lauderdale and Kestenbaum list
15 of Vietnamese surnames.

16 SECTION 2. Notwithstanding section 40 of chapter 54 of the General Laws, or any other
17 general or special law to the contrary, in federal and state elections the state secretary shall
18 prepare bilingual ballots in English and Chinese, and English and Vietnamese in addition to any
19 other bilingual ballots required by law, in the designated polling places within the city of Boston
20 as defined by Section 4 of this act, in addition to any other bilingual ballots required by law.

21 SECTION 3. Notwithstanding section 58 of the charter of the City of Boston, or any
22 other general or special law to the contrary, in all City of Boston municipal elections the election
23 commission shall cause bilingual ballots in English-Chinese, and English-Vietnamese in addition
24 to any other bilingual ballots required by law, in the designated polling places within the city of
25 Boston as defined by Section 4 of this act, in addition to any other bilingual ballots required by
26 law.

27 SECTION 4. English-Chinese bilingual ballots shall be provided in every polling place
28 in the City where there are at least 35 registered voters with Chinese surnames. English-
29 Vietnamese bilingual ballots shall be provided in every polling place in the City where there are
30 at least 30 registered voters with Vietnamese surnames.

31 At least one English-Chinese bilingual ballot per registered voter with a Chinese surname shall
32 be provided in each designated polling place. At least one English-Vietnamese bilingual ballot

33 per registered voter with a Vietnamese surname shall be provided in each designated polling
34 place. In any district, county, state, or federal primary or election the State Secretary may
35 provide additional sets of bilingual ballots for any polling place in the City when he deems it
36 necessary. In any municipal primary or election the City's Election Department may provide
37 additional sets of bilingual ballots for any polling place in the City when it deems necessary.

38 SECTION 5. The Election Commission in all City of Boston municipal elections and the
39 State Secretary in all federal and state elections shall provide for the transliteration of all
40 candidates' names for English-Chinese bilingual ballots. All candidates shall be provided with a
41 written copy of the proposed transliteration of candidate's name. Within seven days of receiving
42 the proposed transliterations of candidate's name, any candidate may provide written notice to
43 the City Election Commission or State Secretary of a modification of the proposed transliteration
44 of candidate's own name or decline to have candidate's own name transliterated on the ballot.
45 The transliteration shall be subject to final approval by the City Election Commission in all City
46 of Boston municipal elections or the State Secretary in all federal and state elections. The City
47 Election Commission or State Secretary shall provide public notice of transliterated names as
48 soon as practicable.

49 SECTION 6. The City of Boston shall record the number of English-Chinese and
50 English-Vietnamese bilingual ballots that are printed, requested, or used in all elections held in
51 the City of Boston.

52 SECTION 7. The provisions of this act shall take effect on its passage

53 SECTION 8. All provisions of this law shall cease to have further effect after December
54 31, 2013, the sunset date.

55 SECTION 9. If any provision of these sections or the application of such provision to
56 any person or circumstance shall be held invalid, the validity of the remainder of these sections
57 and the applicability of any such provision to other persons or circumstances shall not be
58 affected thereby.
