In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act authorizing the town of Middleborough to grant an additional license for the sale of wines and malt beverages not to be drunk on the premises.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Notwithstanding section 17 of chapter 138 of the General Laws, the
- 2 licensing authority of the town of Middleborough may grant 1 additional license for the sale of
- 3 wines and malt beverages not to be drunk on the premises to Reynolds Flowers, Inc. located at
- 4 410 Plymouth street under section 15 of said chapter 138. The license shall be subject to all of
- 5 said chapter 138, except said section 17.
- The licensing authority shall not approve the transfer of the license to any other location
- 7 but it may grant the license to a new applicant at the same location if the applicant files with the
- 8 licensing authority a letter from the department of revenue and a letter from the department of
- 9 unemployment assistance indicating that the license is in good standing with those departments
- 10 and that all applicable taxes, fees and contributions have been paid.

- If the license granted under this act is cancelled, revoked, or no longer in use, it shall be returned physically, with all of legal rights, privileges and restrictions pertaining thereto, to the licensing authority and the licensing authority may then grant the license to a new applicant at
- 15 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
