An Act relative to superintendency union benefits.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Chapter 71 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after  
2 section 64 the following new section:-

3           Section 64A. Notwithstanding section 2 of chapter 32B, towns and regional school  
4 districts in a superintendency union may, in consultation with the joint school committee, enter  
5 into agreements to fund benefits for employees and retirees in the superintendency union in  
6 amounts proportionate to the benefits offered by each town or regional school district to their  
7 municipal or regional school district employees. Such agreements shall be approved by a  
8 majority vote of the select board or council in a town and by the regional district school  
9 committee in a regional school district.
