An Act exempting all disabled and handicapped drivers in Massachusetts from displaying decals or plates of being disabled.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Disabled and handicapped drivers should be exempted from street cleaning  
2 fines (between 8AM -12PM, the time for the street cleaning of whatever city of Massachusetts),  
3 their cars should not be towed, while they are on medical appointments, and they can prove per  
4 medical paperwork, that they were on medical appointments. Alternatively,  
5 Handicapped/Disabled drivers displaying HP decals or Plates, should be warned instead of  
6 arbitrarily and capriciously citing them and towing them.

7           Furthermore, they should be allowed 1 hour to get to their cars to drive to their  
8 destinations, after their medical appointments.
