The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act exempting all disabled and handicapped drivers in Massachusetts from displaying decals or plates of being disabled.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Disabled and handicapped drivers should be exempted from street cleaning
- 2 fines (between 8AM -12PM, the time for the street cleaning of whatever city of Massachusetts),
- 3 their cars should not be towed, while they are on medical appointments, and they can prove per
- 4 medical paperwork, that they were on medical appointments. Alternatively,
- 5 Handicapped/Disabled drivers displaying HP decals or Plates, should be warned instead of
- 6 arbitrarily and capriciously citing them and towing them.
- Furthermore, they should be allowed 1 hour to get to their cars to drive to their
- 8 destinations, after their medical appointments.
