Senate, July 13, 2017 -- The committee on Ways and Means to whom was referred the Senate Bill establishing a sick leave bank for David Banks of 17 Turner Drive of Randolph, a court officer of the West Roxbury District Court (Senate, No. 2107),-- reports, recommending that the same ought to pass with an amendment substituting a new draft entitled "An Act establishing a sick leave bank for David Banks, an employee of the Trial Court of the commonwealth" (Senate, No. 2111) (also based on House, No. 3783).

An Act establishing a sick leave bank for David Banks of 17 Turner Drive of Randolph, a court officer of the West Roxbury District Court.

Whereas, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to establish forthwith a sick leave bank for a certain employee of the trial court, therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience., therefore, it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- Whereas, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to
- 2 establish forthwith a sick leave bank for a certain employee of the trial court of the
- 3 commonwealth, therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the
- 4 immediate preservation of the public convenience.
- 5 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled,
- 6 and by the authority of the same, as follows:

Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the trial court of the commonwealth shall establish a sick leave bank for David Banks, an employee of the West Roxbury division of the Boston municipal court department, held at West Roxbury in Boston in the trial court. Any employee of the trial court may voluntarily contribute 1 or more sick, personal or vacation days to the sick leave bank for use by David Banks. If David Banks terminates employment with the trial court or requests to dissolve the sick leave bank, any remaining time in the sick leave bank shall be transferred to the trial court paid leave bank. Sick leave bank days shall not be used for absences unrelated to the illness or disability that necessitated the establishment of the sick leave bank as determined by the trial court.
