In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act supporting access to training on reproductive and gender-affirming care.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 9A of chapter 112 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2020 Official Edition, is hereby amended, in line 8, by inserting after the word "assigned" the following words:- . Exclusively for the purposes of learning reproductive or gender-affirming

4 care, a student of medicine who has creditably completed not less than two years of study in a

5 legally chartered medical school wherever located may practice medicine in a licensed health

care facility where reproductive or gender-affirming care may be lawfully provided and under

the supervision of a health care provider licensed in the commonwealth who, acting within the

8 scope of that license, may provide reproductive or gender-affirming care.
