authorizing certain pharmacy interns to administer immunizations.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 1 of Chapter 94C112 of the General Laws, as appearing in the
2 2012 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting, after section 24 the following section:-

3 Section 24 ½. A pharmacy intern may engage in the full range of activities conducted by
4 a registered pharmacist provided that at all time he or she is under the direct supervision of a
5 registered pharmacist preceptor. A pharmacy intern may administer immunizations as
6 designated by the Ddepartment of public health provided that the intern has completed an
7 Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education accredited immunization training program and is
8 under the direct supervision of a pharmacist who has met all Bboard qualifications to administer
9 immunizations.

10 For the purposes of this section, a “pharmacy intern” means an individual who has
11 completed two years of academic curriculum or who has standing as a student beyond the
12 second-year class in the undergraduate academic sequence of an approved college/school of
13 pharmacy, and who is registered by the board to acquire, under the direction of a board-approved
14 registered pharmacist preceptor to whom he or she has been assigned, that practical experience
15 which is a prerequisite to examination for personal registration as a pharmacist.
