In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act relative to online driver education.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 32G of chapter 90 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2020
- 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after line 239 the following sentence:-
- 3 The registrar may approve a driver education curriculum presented in a virtual instructor-
- 4 led format by a state-licensed driving school if the following conditions are met:- (a) the driving
- 5 school owns or leases physical offices and/or classrooms in the Commonwealth to provide in-
- 6 person instruction (b) the driving school has no less than three consecutive years of operation in
- 7 the Commonwealth (c) the driving school is in good standing with the Registry of Motor
- 8 Vehicles.
