### AN ACT REGARDING SCHOOL TRANSPORTATION.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Chapter 71, Section 68 is hereby amended by adding after the fourth  
2 sentence thereof the following:

3           The Commonwealth shall reimburse the school committee for budgeted payments made  
4 to furnish mandated transportation to children entitled to attend the public schools pursuant to the  
5 provisions of this section. The Commonwealth shall also reimburse the school committee for any  
6 extraordinary price increases over the amount budgeted by the school committee for school  
7 transportation or fuel for heating and cooling of school facilities, such determination of an  
8 extraordinary price increase to be made by the Commonwealth annually based on an analysis of  
9 the costs of transportation and fuel in the area. Any reimbursements forwarded to a municipality  
10 under the provisions of this section shall be deposited with the treasurer of the municipality and  
11 held as a separate account. The reimbursements held in such separate account may be expended  
12 by the school committee thereof without further appropriation for the cost of school

- 13 transportation or fuel, notwithstanding the provisions of section fifty-three of chapter 44 of the
- 14 general laws.
