In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act concerning Gateway Municipalities.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 3A of chapter 23A, of the General Laws as appearing in the 2012
- 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking the definition for "Gateway municipality" and
- 3 inserting in place thereof the following new definition:-
- 4 "Gateway municipality", a municipality with a population greater than 35,000 and less
- 5 than 250,000; a median household income below the commonwealth's average and a rate of
- 6 education attainment of a bachelor's degree or above that is below the commonwealth's average
- 7 designated by the Secretary of Housing and Economic Development pursuant to this chapter or a
- 8 municipality with a population greater than 65,000 and less than 250,000 that includes at least 3
- 9 census tracts with poverty rates of at least 20 percent and with median family income that does
- 10 not exceed 80 percent of the statewide median family income.
