#### The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act concerning charter school funding.

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Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

Section 89(ff) of Chapter 71 is hereby amended by striking the first sentence of the second paragraph and inserting in place thereof the following:-

In calculating the per pupil foundation budget component, the department shall calculate

a foundation budget for the students from each sending district attending the charter school in the

5 previous fiscal year, pursuant to the provisions of section 2 of Chapter 70; provided, that the

6 department shall not include in said calculation the assumed tuition-out special education

7 enrollment, nor any amounts generated by said assumed enrollment, as defined by said section 2;

8 provided further, that the calculation for assumed in-school special education enrollment

pursuant to said section 2 shall reflect the individual student full-time equivalent enrollment and

only the actual amounts generated by said enrollment in the previous fiscal year.
