The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen

An Act to provide for capital equipment replacement in vocational education as part of state aid to public schools.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 70 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010 Official Edition,
 is hereby amended by striking the definition of "extraordinary maintenance allotment" in lines
 131-135 and inserting in place thereof a new definition: -

"Extraordinary maintenance allotment," the amount allotted within a district's foundation
budget for extraordinary maintenance costs and to provide for modernization and replacement of
capital equipment in vocational schools in any fiscal year. The extraordinary maintenance
allotment shall be two thousand, two hundred dollars multiplied by the sum of foundation
teaching staff and the foundation support staff. The capital equipment replacement allotment
shall be five hundred dollars multiplied by the foundation vocational enrollment.
