An Act repealing Chapter 46 of the Acts of Two Thousand and Seventeen, wherein certain parcels of land in the city of Lowell were transferred for the construction of a high school.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 46 of the Acts of Two Thousand and Seventeen is hereby repealed.

2 SECTION 2. All parcels of land so designated and affected by Chapter 46 of the Acts of
3 Two-Thousand and Seventeen shall revert back to the care and custody of the City of Lowell
4 Board of Parks for their original use as park land, open space, or recreational purposes.

5 SECTION 3. In submitting this legislation, the City of Lowell authorizes the City
6 Manager to create and provide to the General Court and state agencies any and all additional
7 information that may be necessary for passage.

8 SECTION 4. In submitting this legislation, the City of Lowell authorizes the General
9 Court to make such changes in the drafting process as are necessary for passage.

SECTION 5. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
