Ehrlich, Joan B. Lovely and others relative to drinking water at schools and early childhood programs,- reports the accompanying resolve (Senate, No. 2465).

Resolve creating a commission on remediating lead in drinking water of schools and early childhood centers.

1           **Resolved**, There shall be a commission to study the remediation of lead in drinking water  
2 for all private and public schools and center-based child care facilities in the commonwealth. For  
3 the purposes of this resolve, the term “school” shall include any facility operating for the  
4 development and education of children in pre-school through 12th grade, whether operated by a  
5 school district, charter, or non-public entity unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

6           The commission shall consist of the following members: The commissioner of the  
7 department of public health or a designee, who shall serve as co-chair; the commissioner of the  
8 department of elementary and secondary education or a designee, who shall serve as co-chair;  
9 the commissioner of the department of environmental protection or a designee, who shall be  
10 appointed based on their experience or expertise with lead testing and remediation; the  
11 commissioner of the department of early education and care or a designee; 1 of whom shall be a  
12 designee of the Speaker of the Massachusetts House of Representatives; 1 of whom shall be a  
13 designee of the President of the Massachusetts Senate; and 13 members to be appointed by the  
14 governor, 1 of whom shall be a representative recommended by the Massachusetts water  
15 resources authority, 1 of whom shall be a representative of the Massachusetts clean water trust

16 recommended by the treasurer and receiver general, 2 of whom shall be representatives  
17 recommended by the Massachusetts Municipal Association, 1 of whom shall be a representative  
18 recommended by the Massachusetts Association of School Superintendents, 1 of whom shall be  
19 a representative recommended by the Massachusetts Parent Teacher Association, 1 of whom  
20 shall be a representative recommended by the Massachusetts Association of School Committees,  
21 1 of whom shall be a representative recommended by the Massachusetts Teachers Association, 1  
22 of whom shall be a representative recommended by the Massachusetts Chapter of the American  
23 Academy of Pediatrics, 1 of whom shall be a representative from a relevant plumbing trade  
24 union, 1 of whom shall be a representative recommended by the Massachusetts Public Interest  
25 Research Group, 1 of whom shall be a representative recommended by the Toxics Action Center,  
26 1 of whom shall be a representative recommended by Clean Water Action. All appointments  
27 shall be made within sixty (60) days of the enactment of this law.

28           The commission shall develop a report containing, at a minimum: (i) different evidence-  
29 based measures and methods for testing for and remediating the harmful effects of lead in school  
30 and center-based child care facilities' drinking water; (ii) the levels of lead for which each  
31 measure is appropriate; (iii) the estimated cost of implementing each of the testing and  
32 remediation measures; and (iv) the feasibility and limitations for each type of remediation and  
33 testing for lead.

34           The commission shall file the report with the office of the governor, the commissioner of  
35 the department of public health, the commissioner of the department of elementary and  
36 secondary education, the clerk of the Massachusetts House of Representatives, and the clerk of  
37 the Massachusetts Senate no later than a year and two months after the enactment of this law.
