**In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court
(2017-2018)**

An Act establishing a low vision registry.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 1. Chapter 6 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014 Official Edition, is
2 hereby amended by inserting after section 135 the following section:-

3 Section 135A. The Commissioner shall create a registry list of persons whose visual
4 acuity is found to be with correction 20/60 or less in the better eye, or the peripheral field of
5 vision to have contracted to the ten degrees radius or less regardless of visual acuity. Said
6 register shall be used to aid the commission in efforts to measure the numbers of likely future
7 registrants to the Commonwealth Registry of the Blind. Such persons shall not be eligible for
8 services from the Commission until the standard of legal blindness is met.

9 The reporting requirements contained in section 136 of this chapter shall apply to this
10 section.
