## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court (2021-2022)

An Act supporting parents running for public office.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 1 of chapter 55 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2020
- 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the definition of "Candidate's committee"
- 3 the following definition:-
- 4 "Child care services," care services provided to a candidate's child, including but not
- 5 limited to, baby-sitting services by non-profit or for profit organizations that provide such
- 6 services and any other costs directly related to such services that occur as a result of campaign
- 7 activities; provided, however, that expenses related to child-care services shall not include
- 8 payments to a family members, as defined in section 1 of chapter 50, of a child, unless the
- 9 relative owns, operates, or is employed by a professional daycare or babysitting service and the
- 10 cost of the service is not greater than the family member would otherwise charge.
- SECTION 2. Section 6 of said chapter 55, as so appearing, is hereby amended by
- inserting, after the word "to", in line 64, the following words:- the provision of child-care
- 13 services, to.

- SECTION 3. The director of the office of campaign and political finance shall
- promulgate regulations to implement this act not later than July 1, 2023.
