An Act on strengthening and clarifying residency requirements for the purpose of voting .

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1: Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the secretary of  
2 the commonwealth shall conduct a study to review existing laws in regards to residency  
3 requirements for purposes of voting. Secretary shall make any recommendations to strengthen  
4 and clarify residency requirements as they pertain to eligibility for voting in municipal, state, and  
5 federal elections and participation in town meetings, particularly so as to ensure for the  
6 maximum extent possible, that such requirements are clear, easily understood, and enforceable in  
7 an efficient manner. Secretary shall submit the study and recommendations to the clerks of the  
8 senate and house and to the Joint Committee on Election Laws by September 30, 2013.
