The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act relating to contribution fairness.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 7A of said chapter 55, as appearing in the 2014 Official Edition, is hereby
- 2 amended by inserting after subsection (c) the following new subsection:-

3	(d) If not otherwise limited or prohibited from making contributions under this chapter,
4	the aggregate of all contributions by any group, association, labor union or other entity for the
5	benefit of any one candidate and such candidate's committee shall not exceed \$1,000 in a
6	calendar year. If not otherwise limited or prohibited from making contributions under this
7	chapter, the aggregate of all contributions by any group, association, labor union or other entity
8	for the benefit of any other political committee, other than a ballot question committee, shall not
9	exceed \$1,000 in a calendar year.
