## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

#### AN ACT TO PROTECT THE COMMONWEALTH'S HEMLOCK TREES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 1 of Chapter 142A of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2004
- 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out lines 9-13 inclusive and inserting in place
- 3 thereof the following -
- 4 "Claimant" an owner and resident of a residential building, containing at least one but not more
- 5 than four dwelling units, or an owner and resident of a single condominium unit in a residential
- 6 building, who has entered into a construction contract with a contractor to carry out construction
- 7 work on said building, or, for a condominium owner, who has entered into a construction
- 8 contract with a contractor to carry out construction work on an area of said building under that
- 9 owner's exclusive control, and who is making a claim against said contractor for failure of
- 10 performance under said contract.
- SECTION 2. This act shall be effective retroactively to January 1, 1996. Any claim
- which would otherwise be foreclosed under the provisions of section 7 of this chapter shall be

13	considered timely filed with regard to said section 7 if filed within six months of the enactment
14	of this act.
