By Mr. Downing, petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 498) of Garballey and Downing for legislation relative to student health insurance [Joint Committee on Health Care Financing].

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act relative to student health insurance.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 18 of chapter 15A of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding to the end of the first paragraph, in line 12, the
3 following words:- , including the commonwealth care health insurance program under chapter
4 176Q.

5 SECTION 2. Section 1 of chapter 111M of the General Laws, as so appearing, is hereby
6 amended by striking out the words "and (l)", in line 21, and inserting in place thereof the
7 following words:- (l) the commonwealth care health insurance program under chapter 176Q for
8 such health care enrollees who are enrolled in a post-secondary program and qualify for a student
9 health insurance program, under section 18 of chapter 15A, if such students were enrolled in the
10 commonwealth care health insurance program on or before the first day of such full-time, post-
11 secondary program; and (m).

12 SECTION 3. Section 3 of chapter 118H of the General Laws, as so appearing, is hereby
13 amended by inserting after subsection (b) the following subsection:-

14 (c) An individual eligible to participate in the program under subsection (a) on or before the first
15 day of a full-time, post-secondary program shall be allowed to continue on the program even
16 when qualifying for a student
