### The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act to assess the impact of the public welfare system on the health and well-being of children.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. The Department of Public Health, in conjunction with other child and
- 2 family-serving agencies, shall conduct an annual child assessment as part of a child surveillance
- 3 study on the impact of the public welfare system on the health and well-being of the children and
- 4 youth (birth through age 18) of the Commonwealth. Said child health assessment shall include
- 5 but not be limited to: the measure and assessment of nutritional status (through height and weight
- 6 measurements); birth outcomes status (especially birthweights); poverty status; school readiness
- 7 status and safety status (including injury prevalence rates and hospitalization rates) of children
- 8 and youth in the Commonwealth. Said annual child health assessment statement shall be

- 9 submitted to the House and Senate Committees on Ways and Means, the Joint Committee on
- 10 Children, Families and Persons with Disabilities, the Joint Committee on Health Care Financing,
- 11 and the Joint Committee on Education by April 1 of each year.
