An Act to increase access to higher education and job training \Box .

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. In order to encourage every child in Massachusetts to seek higher
- 2 education and to encourage residents of Massachusetts to stay in the Commonwealth, there shall
- 3 be established and set on the books of the Commonwealth a program of Commonwealth
- 4 investment in the future college education of all newly born residents. The Commonwealth shall
- 5 deposit in a separate account to be maintained by the Massachusetts Education Financing
- 6 Authority or in the Massachusetts UFund, the sum of \$5000 for each child born in Massachusetts
- 7 to Massachusetts residents. Exceptions will be defined by the Department of Revenue according
- 8 to their current exceptions. There will be no tax implications on this initial deposit. Additional

9	deposits to this fund are allowed and will have the same federal and state tax implications as the
10	Massachusetts UFund.
