An Act regarding oversight on eligibility for tuition and fee waivers.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Section 19 of Chapter 15A as appearing in the 2010 Official Edition is hereby amended
- 2 by inserting after the word “courses” in line 13 the following paragraph:-
- 3 ; provided, however, that no full or partial waivers of tuition or fees shall be allowed for
- 4 persons not legally residing in the commonwealth unless said tuition or fee waiver is approved
- 5 by a majority vote of each branch of the general court.
