An Act relative to coordination of benefit forms.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 32A of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 17N the following section:-
- 3 Section 17P. Any coverage offered by the commission to an active or retired employee of
- 4 the commonwealth insured under the group insurance commission shall not deny or seek to
- 5 recoup reimbursement to a provider due to a patients' failure to complete a Coordination of
- 6 Benefit form, questionnaire, phone survey or other insurance form.
- 7 SECTION 2. Chapter 175 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after
- 8 section 47GG the following section:-
- 9 Section 47JJ. The following shall not deny or seek to recoup reimbursement to a
- provider due to a patients' failure to complete a Coordination of Benefit form, questionnaire,
- 11 phone survey or other insurance form.

SECTION 3. Chapter 176A of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 8II the following section:-

Section 8LL:. Any contract between a subscriber and the corporation under an individual or group hospital service plan which is delivered, issued or renewed within the commonwealth shall not deny or seek to recoup reimbursement to a provider due to a patients' failure to complete a Coordination of Benefit form, questionnaire, phone survey or other insurance form.

SECTION 4. Chapter 176B of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 4II the following section:-

Section 4LL. Any subscription certificate under an individual or group medical service agreement delivered, issued or renewed within the commonwealth shall not deny or seek to recoup reimbursement to a provider due to a patients' failure to complete a Coordination of Benefit form, questionnaire, phone survey or other insurance form.

SECTION 5. Chapter 176G of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 4AA the following section:-

Section 4DD. Any individual or group health maintenance contract shall not deny or seek to recoup reimbursement to a provider due to a patients' failure to complete a Coordination of Benefit form, questionnaire, phone survey or other insurance form.
