The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act to increase access to nurse-midwifery services.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 32A of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding the

2 following section:-

Section 31. The commission shall provide to any active or retired employee of the commonwealth insured under the group insurance commission coverage for services rendered by a certified nurse midwife designated to engage in the practice of nurse-midwifery by the board of registration in nursing pursuant to section 80C of chapter 112; provided, however, that the following conditions are met: (1) the service rendered is within the scope of the certified nurse midwife's authorization to practice by the board of registration in nursing; (2) the policy or contract currently provides benefits for identical services rendered by a health care provider 10 licensed by the commonwealth; and (3) the reimbursement for the services provided shall be in 11 the same amount as the reimbursement paid under the policy to a licensed physician performing 12 the service in the area served. An insurer may not reduce the reimbursement paid to a licensed 13 physician to achieve compliance with this section.

SECTION 2. Chapter 118E of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding thefollowing section:-

16 Section 80. The division shall provide coverage for services rendered by a certified nurse 17 midwife designated to engage in the practice of nurse-midwifery by the board of registration in 18 nursing pursuant to section 80C of chapter 112; provided, however, that the following conditions 19 are met: (1) the service rendered is within the scope of the certified nurse midwife's 20 authorization to practice by the board of registration in nursing; (2) the policy or contract 21 currently provides benefits for identical services rendered by a health care provider licensed by 22 the commonwealth; and (3) the reimbursement for the services provided shall be in the same 23 amount as the reimbursement paid under the policy to a licensed physician performing the 24 service in the area served. An insurer may not reduce the reimbursement paid to a licensed 25 physician to achieve compliance with this section.

SECTION 3. Section 47E of Chapter 175 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2018 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following sentences:- The reimbursement for the services provided pursuant to this section shall be in the same amount as the reimbursement paid under the policy to a licensed physician performing the service in the area served. An insurer may not reduce the reimbursement paid to a licensed physician in order to comply with this section.

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32 SECTION 4. Chapter 176A of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after
 33 section 800 the following section:-

34 Section 8PP. Any contract between a subscriber and the corporation under an individual or group hospital service plan which is delivered, issued or renewed in the commonwealth shall 35 36 provide as a benefit to all individual subscribers and members within the commonwealth and to 37 all group members having a principal place of employment within the commonwealth for 38 services rendered by a certified nurse midwife designated to engage in the practice of nurse-39 midwifery by the board of registration in nursing pursuant to section 80C of chapter 112; 40 provided, however, that the following conditions are met: (1) the service rendered is within the 41 scope of the certified nurse midwife's authorization to practice by the board of registration in 42 nursing; (2) the policy or contract currently provides benefits for identical services rendered by a 43 health care provider licensed by the commonwealth; and (3) the reimbursement for the services 44 provided shall be in the same amount as the reimbursement paid under the policy to a licensed 45 physician performing the service in the area served. An insurer may not reduce the 46 reimbursement paid to a licensed physician in order to comply with this section.

SECTION 5. Section 4G of Chapter 176B of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2018 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following sentences:- The reimbursement for the services provided pursuant to this section shall be in the same amount as the reimbursement paid under the policy to a licensed physician performing the service in the area served. An insurer may not reduce the reimbursement paid to a licensed physician in order to comply with this section. 53 SECTION 6. Section 4 of Chapter 176G is of the General Laws, as so appearing, is
54 hereby amended by adding the following subsection:-

(g) services rendered by a certified nurse midwife designated to engage in the practice of nurse-midwifery by the board of registration in nursing pursuant to section 80C of chapter 112, subject to the terms of a negotiated agreement between the health maintenance organization and the provider of health care services. The reimbursement for the services provided shall be in the same amount as the reimbursement paid under the policy to a licensed physician performing the service in the area served. An insurer may not reduce the reimbursement paid to a licensed physician in order to comply with this section.
