An Act relative to the common defense..

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 278: Section 8A. Killing or injuring a person defense of self or
- 2 others;
- 3 Section 8A. It shall be an act of lawful defense if a person, who is an occupant of a dwelling or
- 4 in any place that they have a right to be, used deadly force, or less than deadly force, if he or she
- 5 acted in the reasonable belief that an assailant was about to inflict great bodily injury or death
- 6 upon themselves or upon another person who also had a right to be in the location. There shall be
- 7 no duty on a person to retreat from any place that they have a right to be. An act of lawful
- 8 defense as outlined in this section shall not be cause for arrest or prosecution. Further, an act of

- 9 lawful defense under this section shall not be cause for the revocation of a license issued under
- 10 sections, 122, 123, 129B or 131 of Chapter 140.
- 11 SECTION 2. Chapter 231: Section 85U. Death or injury to assailants; liability of
- 12 defender
- 13 Section 85U. No person who has committed an act of lawful defense as outlined in section 8A of
- 14 chapter 278 shall be held liable in an action for damages for death or injuries to an assailant.
