An Act relative to the compensation of a guardian ad litem in a contempt action..

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 215 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2006 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking section 56B and inserting in place thereof the following section:—
- Section 56B. Any judge of the probate and family court may appoint a guardian ad litem 4 to institute contempt proceedings under the provisions of section thirty-four A against any party
- 5 for failure to obey judgments of the probate and family court involving care, custody or
- 6 maintenance of minor children, and said guardian ad litem may personally serve throughout the
- 7 commonwealth any summons or capias incidental to the enforcement of this section. The
- 8 compensation of such guardian ad litem together with any expenses shall be determined by the
- 9 court and be paid by the defendant or by the commonwealth as the court may order, upon
- 10 certification by the judge to the state treasurer. The state police, local police and probation
- 11 officers shall assist the guardian ad litem so appointed, upon his request.
