An Act relative to the recording of judgments, decrees and orders of the Probate and Family Court .

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Section 36 of chapter 215 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2006
2	Official Edition is hereby amended by striking Section 36 and inserting in place thereof the
3	following section:— Judgments, decrees and orders of the probate and family court shall be in
4	writing, and in contested cases or in cases wherein the court has reserved judgment, notices
5	thereof shall be given by the registers to the attorneys of record, and in the absence of an attorney
6	of record, to any party who has appeared personally and given his address. The registers shall
7	record such judgments, decrees, orders and other proceedings in said courts and such
8	instruments, as shall be determined by rules made from time to time under section thirty, by
9	entering the same into the statewide electronic database as approved by the Administrative

- 10 Office of the Trial Court. They may also direct the recording of any judgments, decrees, orders,
- 11 instruments and other proceedings in their offices, irrespective of the time when such judgments,
- 12 decrees, orders, instruments or other proceedings were made, received or held.
