In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act to lift kids out of deep poverty.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Section 2 of chapter 118 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2020
2	Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking the fourth paragraph and inserting in place
3	thereof the following new paragraph:- "Notwithstanding any general or special law to the
4	contrary, the payment standards for monthly benefits for the program not including the rental
5	allowance shall be increased effective July first of each year beginning with July 1, 2023 by 25
6	percent above the payment standard in effect in the previous fiscal year until the payment
7	standard for the household size equals 50 percent of the federal poverty level for the household
8	size; provided further, that once the payment standard for the household size equals 50 percent of
9	the federal poverty level for the household size, the payment standard shall be increased effective
10	July first of each year in order that the payment standard shall be no less than 50% of the poverty

11 level for the household size as determined by the federal Department of Health and Human 12 Services; provided further, that the need standard and the payment amounts shall be further 13 increased by the amount of a clothing allowance in the month for which it is paid and by the 14 rental allowance for households incurring a rent or mortgage expense and not residing in public 15 or subsidized housing."

16 SECTION 2. Section 1 of chapter 117A of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2020 17 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the first paragraph the following new 18 paragraph:- "Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the payment standards 19 for monthly benefits for the program shall be increased effective July first of each year beginning 20 with July 1, 2023 by 25 percent above the payment standard in effect in the previous fiscal year 21 until the payment standard for the household size equals 50 percent of the federal poverty level 22 for the household size; provided further, that once the payment standard for the household size 23 equals 50 percent of the federal poverty level for the household size, the payment standard shall 24 be increased effective July first of each year in order that the payment standard shall be no less 25 than 50% of the poverty level for the household size as determined by the federal Department of 26 Health and Human Services".
