The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act establishing a community college campus hunger pilot program.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 15A of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 44 the following section:-
- 3 Section 45. Community College Campus Hunger Program
- 4 There shall be established and set up on the books of the commonwealth a fund to
- 5 address food insecurity on community college campuses that shall be known as the
- 6 Massachusetts Community College Campus Hunger Program. The fund shall be credited with:
- 7 (i) revenue from appropriations or other monies authorized by the general court and specifically
- 8 designated to the fund; (ii) interest earned on such revenues; and (iii) funds from public and
- 9 private sources including, but not limited to, gifts, grants and donations to further the program.
- The department of higher education shall distribute resources from the fund by issuing a
- request for proposal through which community colleges may apply. The department shall grant
- 12 funds based on the demonstrated need and implementation plan of each applicant. Funds

- received by college campuses shall be used to address food insecurity among students via means
- 14 including, but not limited to, meal cards, meal plans, meal vouchers, and other campus-designed
- projects to address community college student food insecurity.
