An Act to clarify the venue of prosecution for larceny by check.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 277 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012 Official Edition, is hereby  
2 amended by inserting after section 62C the following section:-

3 Section 62D. The crime set forth in section 37 of chapter 266 may be prosecuted and  
4 punished in any judicial district where the check, draft or order for the payment of money was  
5 executed or delivered, or where the money or property or services obtained thereby were  
6 delivered.
