An Act relative to police pursuits.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 25 of Chapter 90 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014 Official Edition,
2 by adding to the end of said section 25 the following:-

3 Any person who, while operating or in charge of a motor vehicle, when being pursued by
4 a police officer in an official police vehicle displaying lights and siren, shall refuse or neglect to
5 stop, shall be punished by a fine of not less than one thousand dollars nor more than ten thousand
6 dollars and imprisonment in State Prison for not less than thirty days nor more than two and one-
7 half years, or both such fine and imprisonment.
