In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act relative to Forest Hills Cemetery.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 6 of chapter fifty-seven of the Acts of Eighteen Hundred and Sixty-
- 2 eight is hereby amended in line 2 by striking out the words "on the fourth Monday of March in
- 3 each year", and inserting in place thereof the words "each year at a date to be established by the
- 4 trustees", so that said section 6 reads in its entirety as follows:
- 5 "The annual meetings of said corporation shall be held each year at a date to be
- 6 established by the trustees, at such place in the city of Boston as the trustees shall direct, and
- 7 notices thereof, signed by the secretary, shall be published in tow or more of the newspapers
- 8 printed in Boston, at least seven days before the meeting; special meetings may be called by the
- 9 trustees in the same manner. At all meetings of said corporation a quorum for business shall
- 10 consist of not less than fifteen members, either present in person or represented by proxy, and

- 11 any business may be transacted, of which notice shall be given in the advertisements for the
- 12 meeting, and all questions shall be decided by a majority of the members present and
- 13 represented, and voting either in person or by proxy."
