AN ACT REDUCING MEDICATION ERRORS IN THE COMMONWEALTH.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- Section 1. Section 16E(b) of Chapter 6A of the General Laws is hereby amended by
- 2 inserting the following paragraphs:- "Adverse drug event", Any injury due to medication.
- 3 "Medication error", Any error occurring in the medication-use process.
- 4 Section 2. Section 16E of Chapter 6A of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting the
- 5 following section:- (g) The department of public health, in consultation with the center, shall
- 6 create an independent expert panel to study medication errors and adverse drug events. At least 1
- 7 member of the expert panel shall be a health care consumer representative. The expert panel shall
- 8 issue a report on the frequency, nature and location of occurrence of medication errors and
- 9 adverse drug events. The expert panel shall make recommendations for reducing medication
- 10 errors and adverse drug events across all settings of care. The expert panel shall file a
- comprehensive report under this section with the Joint Committees on Public Health and Health
- 12 Care Financing no later than December 31, 2010. Based on the panel's recommendations, the
- department of public health shall promulgate regulations to reduce medication errors in the
- 14 Commonwealth.
