An Act relative to probation violations.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           Section 3 of Chapter 279 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2020 Official Edition,  
2 is hereby amended by striking out, in lines 14 and 15, the words “such suspension is revoked, the  
3 sentence shall be in full force and effect” and inserting in place thereof the following:- the  
4 defendant violates a condition of probation, the court may (a) continue him on probation with or  
5 without extending the term or modifying or enlarging the conditions; or (b) revoke the sentence  
6 of probation and commit the defendant to an intermediate sanctions program or impose all or any  
7 portion of the suspended sentence.
