By Mr. Eldridge, a petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 942) of James B. Eldridge, Carlo Basile, William N. Brownsberger, Jason M. Lewis and other members of the General Court for legislation to protect abandoned animals in vacant properties. Municipalities and Regional Government.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen

An Act protecting abandoned animals in vacant properties.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 186 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010 Official Edition,
 is hereby amended by inserting the following section:-

3 Section 23. Within 5 days of a property being vacated through foreclosure, termination of 4 tenancy, abandonment or other removal or exclusion of a tenant from the premises pursuant to 5 said chapter 186 or chapter 186A, the lessor or owner shall inspect the property for the presence 6 of abandoned animals.

7 If the lessor or owner encounters an abandoned animal pursuant to this section, the lessor
8 or owner shall immediately notify an animal control officer appointed pursuant to chapter 140 or
9 police officer or any other authorized agent of the presence and condition of the animal.

Prompt reporting shall be considered evidence of sufficient regard for the suffering of the animal. The lessor or owner who encounters an abandoned animal pursuant to this subsection shall not be considered the owner, possessor, or person having the charge or custody of an animal under Section 77 of chapter 272.

For the purposes of this section, an animal shall be deemed abandoned if it is found in a property vacated through foreclosure, summary process, termination of tenancy or abandonment.

16 SECTION 2. Section 4 of chapter 239 of the General Laws, as so appearing, is hereby 17 amended in subsection (a) by inserting after the first sentence the following words:- , except that 18 if an animal is found on the land or tenement, said officer shall immediately notify an animal 19 control officer appointed pursuant to chapter 140 or police officer or any other authorized agent20 of the presence and condition of the animal.

21 SECTION 3. Said chapter 239 of the General Laws, as so appearing, is hereby further 22 amended by inserting the following section:-

23 Section 14. Within 5 days of a property being vacated as a result of summary process the 24 lessor or owner shall inspect the property for the presence of abandoned animals.

If the lessor or owner encounters an abandoned animal pursuant to this section or section 4, the lessor or owner shall immediately notify an animal control officer appointed pursuant to chapter 140 or police officer or any other authorized agent of the presence and condition of the animal.

Prompt reporting shall be considered evidence of sufficient regard for the suffering of the animal. The person or entity who encounters an abandoned animal pursuant to this section shall not be considered the owner, possessor, or person having the charge or custody of an animal under Section 77 of chapter 272.

For the purposes of this section, an animal shall be deemed abandoned if it is found in a vacated property through foreclosure, summary process, termination of tenancy or abandonment.

35 SECTION 4. Section 4 of said chapter 239, as so appearing, is hereby amended in the 36 first paragraph by inserting after the last sentence the following sentence:- This section shall not 37 apply to animals removed in accordance section 23 of chapter 186 or section 41 of chapter 244 38 or section 14 of this chapter.

39 SECTION 5. Chapter 244 of the General Laws, as so appearing, is hereby amended by 40 inserting the following section:-

41 Section 41. Within 5 days of a property being vacated through mortgage foreclosure, the 42 mortgagee or owner shall inspect the property for the presence of abandoned animals.

If the mortgagee or owner encounters an abandoned animal pursuant to this section, the
lessor or owner shall immediately notify an animal control officer appointed pursuant to chapter
140 or police officer or any other authorized agent of the presence and condition of the animal.

Prompt reporting shall be considered evidence of sufficient regard for the suffering of the animal. The person or entity who encounters an abandoned animal pursuant to this section shall not be considered the owner, possessor, or person having the charge or custody of an animal under Section 77 of chapter 272.

50 For the purposes of this section, an animal shall be deemed abandoned if it is found in a 51 vacated property through foreclosure, summary process, termination of tenancy or abandonment.
