**In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court
(2017-2018)**

An Act relative to protecting biometric information under the security breach law.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 1 of chapter 93H of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the second paragraph the following
3 paragraph:-

4 “Biometric indicator”, any unique biological attribute or measurement that can be used to
5 authenticate the identity of an individual, including but not limited to fingerprints, genetic
6 information, iris or retina patterns, voice recognition, facial characteristics or hand geometry.

7 SECTION 2. Section 1 of chapter 93H of the General Laws is hereby further amended
8 by striking out, in line 45, the word “or”.

9 SECTION 3. Section 1 of chapter 93H of the General Laws is hereby further amended
10 by inserting after the word “public” in line 52, the following words:-
